Upcoming Events

Ice Cream Social: What a great excuse to eat ice cream! Come visit with the teachers, re-meet our new principal, and say hi to your friends! The classrooms will be closed for this event.

School Supplies: Supplies can be sent with your child on the first day of school. Please don't bring them to the Ice Cream Social. Many of the supplies will be put into bins in our community room for general use. The first few days of school, you will see labeled bins in the hallway - you or or child can sort your school supplies there. Check with your child's teacher if you don't see a bin for a specific item, as some items are classroom specific.

K/1 Assessments: Sign-up for an assessment appointment during registration for your K/1 student. Teachers will do assessments from the 19th to the 25th. Teachers will be contacting families no later than the 25th to let them know which classroom their 1st grader will be in.

Parent Information Night: Not quite like back to school night, as we encourage parents to come without kids. We'd like you to be able to focus on what the teachers have to say about everything from classroom expectations to curriculum. It's important that you know what your students are going to be responsible for this year! PIN is also a great opportunity to learn more about the different activities we offer students and to sign up for your volunteer hours. Bring your calendar!!

Garden Harvest: All year long the kids work on the garden. If you are new to the program, soup day and the Harvest Potluck are a treat! Helping the kids harvest the garden is a fun way to get to know more about how we do things, to meet other parents, and spend some time with your kids in school. We will send out a request for help with this activity.

Soup making: September 10th!! Fabulous fun! Kids start early in the day laboring over the crockpots, cutting veggies, reading recipes, measuring and spicing. The soups are fantastic and the kids LOVE, LOVE, LOVE to cook together. We need LOTS of help with this activity, and it's another great way to meet other parents, and spend time with the kids.

Harvest Potluck: We will be doing some sort of classroom assignment for types of foods to bring to the potluck this year. We will keep you posted! Be on the lookout for email and Facebook updates on this.

Some Notes about the potluck: This is an awesome event. It gets better every year, in every way. Last year we practically licked the crockpots clean the soups were so good. We hope that every family can come. Because it's a pretty large event, we do our best to organize the room so that everyone can get food on their plates as quickly as possible.

Expectations of kid behavior: You are responsible for your child during this event. Teachers in attendance are there because they are a part of our community, and aren't there to wrangle kids. In the past we could have filmed "Kids Gone Crazy" episodes during this event. Kids really do need to be using school behavior. They can not roam the halls, as there are people working in the building. *The gym will be CLOSED during this event.* Kids should be in the MPR.

Evening's agenda: Steering committee will introduce themselves. At this point there are no agenda items. Parents will have the opportunity to ask questions. We eat lots of soup and other yummy stuff, meet new friends, and have an all around good time.

Learning Labs: Throughout the year we offer Learning Labs to Optional kids and parents. Learning Labs are an opportunity for parents to come and share something they are passionate about! It's great for kids to see their parents as leaders, and even though they may not admit it - they are proud to show you off. Labs are setup for small groups (6-10 depending on topic), last around 2 hours, and can be on just about anything.
